
Kudos For Pelican

ogy of short stories about farm life—has received much interest and critical acclaim, including use as a text this spring in a University of Nebraska English class.



The Forgotten Pilgrimage of Jesus



Could the "Public Ministry" of Jesus have begun much earlier than the Bible tells us?

The Forgotten Pilgrimage of Jesus: Sojourn in the Land of the Wise Men suggests that this may well have been the case. This book, listed in Publisher's Weekly's survey of New Age books (Dec. 16, 1988), contains the complete translation of scrolls discovered in a Tibetan monastery at the close of the last century. The scrolls indicate that Jesus may have traveled with a caravan of merchants to India as a young man and there began his teaching. Includes Russian explorer Nicholas Notovitch's story of how he found the scrolls, evidence by India native Virchand R. Gandhi that supports this pilgrimage, and a special chapter on St. Thomas in India from the writings of A.E. Medlycott.

James F. Forcucci has spent many years researching the 18 years "about which the Evangelists are silent." The result is this compilation of selected writings, sprinkled with Forcucci's own objective commentary which helps clarify certain questions.
